Alan and Angela Mahan are the owners of the up and coming family business known as 'Rabbit Ridge Farms'.

Located in Bee Branch, AR., the Mahans opened the business in the beginning of 2018. The traditional cattle farm turned multifunctional event destination, hits to the heart of rural grassroots business. Center stage at Rabbit Ridge Farms is a massive red barn which immediately catches ones attention when approaching the farm.

Inside, however, is nothing short of an upscale lodging facility, event hall, gourmet kitchen and eatery. The building is available for weddings, banquets and conferences, large and small. Rabbit Ridge Farms has hosted nights with musical performances appealing to any generation and/or genre. They are fully equipped with private rooms specifically tailored for large parties planning to stay for a weekend or more. 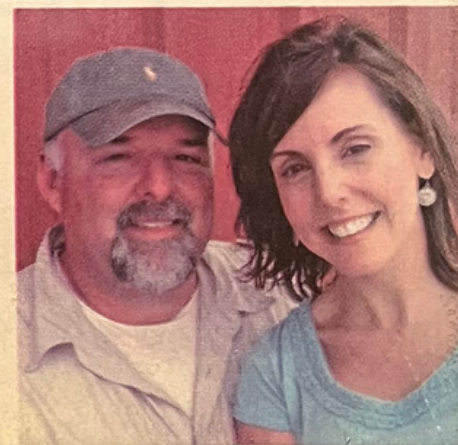

Additionally, every single bite is scrumptious !!! Owner, Alan Mahan, says "If you leave here hungry, well....that's your own fault." Ham cured to perfection and falling apart, thick juicy pork chops, loaded cheesy mashed potatoes, yeast rolls, savory baked beans and one of a kind sauces leave plates cleared, bellies full and customers happy.

RRF also sells hams, bacon, steaks, chicken and a variety of other products on site at the at their retail area or by custom order.
